Petroleum Pump Prices Revised

Saturday, 31st December 2022

The Energy Regulation Board (ERB) has reduced the pump prices of petroleum products by K1.40/litre for petrol, K0.94/litre for diesel and K0.47/litre for kerosene. Further, the ERB has adjusted downwards the posted airfield price (PAP) of Jet A-1 at Kenneth Kaunda International Airport (KKIA) by K0.60/litre.

At the last review which yielded the December 2022 fuel prices, the average price of petrol, diesel and kerosene in the Arab Gulf international market was US\$94.45/bbl, US\$127.60/bbl US\$78.67/bbl, US\$106.13/bbl respectively compared to US\$118.97/bbl, US\$103.64/bbl, respectively for the current price review. The movements represent reductions of 16.71%, 16.82% and 12.88% for petrol, diesel and kerosene respectively.

The fall in oil prices at the end of November was owing to central banks aggressively raising interest rates to counter surging inflation, triggering fears of a global economic slowdown. Additionally, China's COVID-19 restrictions also diminished demand for finished petroleum products.

During this price review period, the exchange rate depreciated from K16.48/US\$ to K17.61/US\$, representing 6.86% depreciation. The depreciation was mainly attributed to the demand pressures from the private sector importing consumer goods for the festive period.

In line with the ERB pricing mechanism, the combined effect of the changes in the two factors (exchange rate and international oil prices) has resulted in the downward adjustment in the prices for petrol, diesel, kerosene and jet A-1, which were all above the 2.50% wholesale price trigger band.

Based on the fore-going, the following are the determined changes in the national uniform pump prices for January 2023:
