Review of Petroleum Pump Prices for September 2026

The Energy Regulation Board (ERB) has reviewed the domestic petroleum product prices for September 2026.

During the period under review, international oil price for Petrol, Diesel and Kerosene/Jet A-I experienced upward pressure following the continued geopolitical tensions in the Middle East. This resulted into upward pressure on domestic prices from the combined movements in international oil prices and the exchange rate. Despite the stated movements in pricing fundamentals, the ERB has maintained the pump prices of domestic petroleum products for September 2026. This is premised on the continued policy mitigation through the suspension of Excise Duty and zero rating of Value Added Tax (VAT) in addition to regulatory price smoothening mechanism. Consequently, the price of Petrol has been maintained at K25.29/litre, Diesel at K26.86/litre, Kerosene at K27.02/litre and Jet A-I at K28.71/litre. These recommended pump prices are shown below.

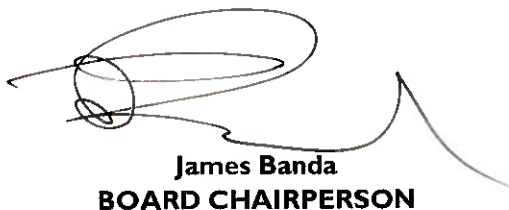
